## How to play

### WHAT'S INCLUDED?

#### Quiz Master Sheets

These sheets give the Quiz Master both the questions and the answers. There are x 9 categories (science, music, geography, general knowledge, sport, food, film, arts & culture, history) which include x10 questions per round. We have provided two versions using different questions, should you wish to host more than one quiz night.

#### Answer Sheets

There is a sheet for each category, with space for the team name to be written at the top.

#### Score Sheet

To be used by the quiz master to make note of the scores after each round.

#### Poster

To help promote the Quiz Night.

#### Team Certificate

To present to the winning team on the night, with space for the Team name to be written on.

### HOW TO PLAY?

1. Print one copy of the Quiz Master questions and one copy of the Score Sheet. These are to be used by the Quiz Master only and should be kept concealed from the view of any players both before and during the event.
2. Print multiple copies of Answer Sheets for each round / category on one-sided paper. Each team will need one copy only of each round / category.
3. The Quiz Master should collect money from each team (suggestion of £1 or £2 per player) at the start, whilst handing out Answer Sheets.
4. Once all teams have arrived and paid, the quiz begins.
5. The Quiz Master will play one round / category at a time, reading questions and giving teams time to discuss and write answers.
6. After each round / category, Quiz Master asks teams to swap their Answer Sheets with neighbouring teams. The Quiz Master then reads through the answers to each question with the teams scoring the Answer Sheets.
7. The Quiz Master asks for the scored Answer Sheets to be handed back to the relevant teams to see their scores and review.
8. The Quiz Master collects the scored Answer Sheets from the previous round and adds each team's score to the Score Sheet.
9. Repeat stages 5 to 8 above for each round/ category.
10. After the final round / category the Quiz Master adds up the total for each team and writes the winning team name on the certificate.
11. The Quiz Master announces the scores, working backwards from the lowest scoring team through to the winning team, and presents the winning team with a certificate.

### ADDED EXTRAS

#### *Here are some suggestions to help boost the event!*

- Ensure you tell teams throughout the evening about why you have chosen to support PDSA.
- Make sure you promote the event well, make use of the poster we have provided and place it locally for maximum attendance
- Offer a bottle of wine as a winning prize and something fun as a consolation prize for the losing team.
- Offer sandwiches or light snacks at half time (the host venue may be able to help with this)
- Offer a fun picture round as a bonus round
- Ask each team to choose a 'Joker' round (only one round per team). This is where they choose their best subject and write 'Joker' on the relevant Answer Sheet. They receive double points for any correct answers during this round.
- Put up bunting (see our Fundraising downloads) and any other branded PDSA items such as balloons or posters.
- Provide Collection Buckets during the event for anyone who may wish to make more of a donation to PDSA.

Flearoy the cat survived a 50 foot plunge from an apartment window. His owner Emma said, "He's a major part of the family so it was awful to see him in so much pain – it was devastating". Emma was in desperate need of help when a friend told her about PDSA. A call confirmed Emma was eligible and Flearoy was referred to the charity's Manchester PDSA Pet Hospital.

Emma added: "I'm incredibly grateful to PDSA. Without them I would have had no choice but to put my gorgeous Flearoy to sleep - I couldn't have afforded the treatment to get him fixed, and borrowing money just wasn't an option."
