You will need:  
Coloured paper  
Black marker

1.

Fold a square piece of paper in half from corner to corner to make a triangle.

2.

Fold along the long edge.

3.

Fold one half back to meet the centre of the triangle.

4.

Fold the other half in to match it.

5.

Fold the bottom up to make the base.

5.

Turn it over and fold the top point inside to make the top of the rabbit's head.

Don't forget that rabbits need a friend to live with – so remember to make two!

Then give your rabbit a face!

# Make your own dog mask >>>

1. Colour in the mask
2. Ask a grown-up to help you cut out the mask along the dotted line (remember to cut out the eyes)
3. Glue the mask to a piece of thin cardboard (the inside of a cereal box works really well)
4. Cut out the holes either side of the mask
5. Attach some string, ribbon or elastic, so the mask can be secured at the back of your head

# MAXE

## a gallery-worthy piece of art

Could you be the next Pablo Picasso or Van Gogh?

Use PVA glue if you don't have a glue gun.

### You will need:

- ★ A blank canvas
- ★ Wax Crayons
- ★ A hot glue gun
- ★ Glue sticks
- ★ A hair dryer
- ★ Newspaper



**1.** Sort the crayons into colour groups and remove the brown, white and black crayons.

**2.** Ask an adult to help you glue the crayons into your desired shape. It can be any shape you want – even a straight line.



**3.** Cover your working area with newspaper. Melting the wax crayons can be quite messy.



**4.** Position your canvas at an angle so the drips run down. Heat three crayons at a time using a hair dryer – make sure you keep rotating the canvas as you heat the crayons or your drips will go the wrong way.



*Tip: Spread the drips further using the heat from your hair dryer.*

**5.** Leave your canvas to dry. This should take around 2 hours.

# MAKE Chocolate pizza

## You'll need:

- ☒ Chocolate
- ☒ A mixture of sweets
- ☒ A bowl
- ☒ A cake tin
- ☒ Foil

**1.**



Cover your cake tin in kitchen foil. This will help you remove your pizza in one piece.

**2.**



Break your chocolate into a microwaveable bowl.

**3.**



Ask an adult to help you melt the chocolate either in the microwave or over a pan of water on the stove.

**4.**



Pour the melted chocolate into your foil-covered cake tin and shake gently until it's level.

**5.**



Decorate your pizza by adding your sweets. Push each sweet into the chocolate so it stays in place.

**6.**

Once you're happy with your topping, place the tin in the fridge and leave for 3 hours or until solid.

**7.**



Gently remove your pizza from the cake tin. You may need an adult to help you.

Ask an adult to cut your pizza into slices and enjoy ...

**Yummy!**

# Fun Animal HandPrints

You'll need ... green and grey paint, a paintbrush, a paint tray, pens and some white paper.

## Tortoise Print

1.

Paint your hand green and press it hard on to paper.



2.

Wash your hand!

3.

When the paint is dry, add lighter green spots on to the palm section of the hand print. This will be the shell.

4.

Paint around the whole palm section in a dark green.

5.

Draw little feet on the end of each finger using a black felt pen.

6.

Finally, add a big smiley face to your tortoise!

## Elephant Print

1.

Paint your hand grey and press it hard on to paper.



2.

Wash your hand!

3.

When the paint is dry, using a lighter shade of grey, add a big ear to the palm section, and a tail.



4.

When the print is dry, add little lines to the bottom of each finger



5.

Next, using white paint, add a little tusk on the thumb section.



6.

Add some detail around the ear and tail using black felt pen



7.

Finally, give your elephant a big grin using black felt pen!

# MAKE

## a fork painting

### You will need:

- Paints
- A plastic fork
- Glue
- Coloured/white paper
- Scissors

**1.** Place a blob of paint in the middle of your page.



**2.** Start dragging your fork through the blob of paint.



**3.** Repeat this until you get a circle.



**4.** Dip the other end of your fork in the paint and draw on your ears.



**5.** Cut a nose shape and eye shapes out of paper and stick them on using glue.



**6.** Using the tip of your fork again, paint the pupil on to your eyes.

You can also use two colours, like we have on our dog:

**7.** Using a different colour of paint, use the end of the fork to paint on your whiskers and ta da, you have a fork cat.

### You'll need:

#### Equipment:

- ☒ Yogurt pots/plastic milk containers (washed and dried)
- ☒ Scissors
- ☒ Glue
- ☒ White paper/ Non-toxic white acrylic paint
- ☒ Non-toxic coloured paints and brushes
- ☒ Coloured paper
- ☒ Black marker pen

1

Cover the yogurt pots with three coats of white acrylic paint (after each coat allow to dry) or cover with white paper.



2

Then paint over the white canvas with your favourite colours, stamps etc.



3

You could also trace your patterns onto the coloured paper.

4

Cut out the shapes and stick on to the yogurt pots with glue.



5

Cut the milk container in half.



6

Using the bottom half, draw shapes of ears & cut out.

7

Paint the outside in your favourite colour.



8

Allow it to dry before painting a second coat.

9

Draw on the eyes, nose & mouth with your black marker to make a face.

# MAKE a bug hotel!

WOW!

Do you still find yourself with plastic items that can't be recycled? Well, why not put them to use and give the bugs in your garden a home?

Our bug hotel is still a work in progress, but we're always adding to it and the bugs have already moved in!

Here are some ideas of how you can create one of these simply, and at no cost, in your own garden.

We made this secret hideaway by cutting small pop bottles in half and filling them with any thrown away straws. Make sure the straws are securely in place for your bug hotel.

You can also glue these pots around the other way as their drainage holes make a great secret entrance for the bugs.

We've also added pine cones and items we found in the garden to make our hotel look more interesting.

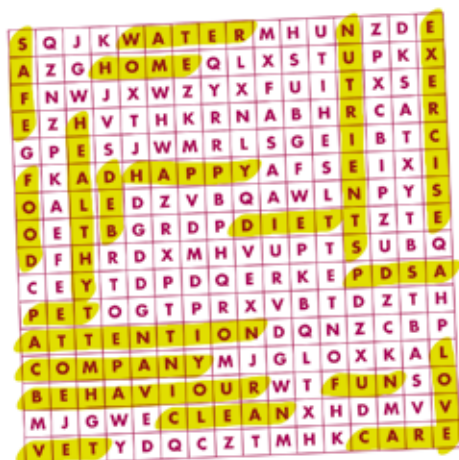
